FROM THE DESERT... A NEW FEATURE

"From the Desert..." will be an on-going feature in each Paradise Arabians Newsletter. It will be a topic that relates to the history and mystique of Egyptian Arabian horses, as requested by several clients. If you are interested in a particular topic, please let us know.

Today's topic was suggested by Nancy Korekach, and it involves the Bedouin legend of "The Bloody Shoulder Arabian." Carole and Jim Deegan imported a rare and special mare from Israel in 1998. The mare, Mona*, foaled a very special colt by Salaa El Dine, who was born with the legendary "bloody shoulder". He was named The Source, a term sometimes used for the Holy Land, and went on to become an Egyptian Event Champion and leading sire. The Source has since been sold to New Zealand. However, one of his daughters, Intaada FA, is here at PARADISE, and she has this classic, legendary birthmark. Intaada is owned by Drs. Margaret and Earl Feurtado of Little Rock, Ar. Interestingly, Intaada's bloody shoulder is actually located on her girth, not her shoulder. This lovely mare is available for sale, and she does carry some rare outcross blood, not normally found in the US.

They were so thrilled to get to do this! And Heather helped them bring Breeze out of the pasture and then, since Shonda wanted to walk back with her mare, Heather walked along with them, ever watchful that both Breeze and Shonda had a safe and wonderful experience going back to the barns.
